The Institute of Oriental Culture, one of the fourteen research institutes of the University of Tokyo, is a distinguished center of Asian studies in Japan. The Institute is characterized by the interdisciplinary studies. The research staff is composed at present of thirty specialists in various disciplines in the humanities and social sciences, such as history, literature, religion, art, archaeology, political science, law, economics, human geography and cultural anthropology. The following geographical areas are covered: East Asia, Northeast Asia, South Asia, Southeast Asia and West Asia. Researches emphasize the analysis of literature as well as field surveys, keeping close contact with scholars of related fields, including local scholars in different regions in Asia.

The professors and associate professors holding appointments in the Institute form a permanent committee which covers Institute affairs, including the appointment of research staff. This committee is chaired by the Director. The Institute's faculty also teach post-graduate students in various departments of the University of Tokyo. In addition, the Institute includes a number of research assistants, librarians and administrative staff. Since 1966 the Documentation Center has been affiliated with the Institute and is run by specially appointed lecturers and assistants.

CURRENT RESEARCH PROJECTS

In addition to individual researches Research Projects are regularly conducted by work groups. Each project, which involves one or more work groups, normally lasts several years with occasional revisions and changes in subjects and participants. Each group invites the participation of scholars in related fields from different faculties of the University of Tokyo as well as from other universities. A large number of scholars are thus affiliated with the Institute. The following is the list of projects currently being carried out.

1. State structure and bureaucracy in ancient China.
2. Polity, law, religion and society in ancient and medieval India.
3. Colonial experience and nation-building in China, the Philippines, Indonesia, Burma and India.
4. Foreign policy and its domestic foundations in Asian countries: comparative analysis of the relationships between the external state action and its internal sources.
5. Comparative analysis of economic and social development in China, Korea, Indonesia, Thailand and Iran.
6. Socio-economic changes in traditional agrarian villages in Indonesia, Thailand, Bangladesh and Iran.
7. Buddhism, Taoism and Confucianism and their interaction in China and Korea.
8. Comparative study of the meanings and social functions of rituals in India, Southeast Asia and Korea.
9. Collection and classification of copies of Chinese paintings kept in various institutions in Japan and abroad.

10. Chinese theatrical plays in Southern China and Southeast Asia.
11. Islam and Muslim civilization in Egypt, Iran, Afghanistan and India.
12. The art history and prehistory of West Asia: Ancient cultural contacts between West Asia and Japan.

LIBRARY

The Library of the Institute lists more than 350,000 titles, including one of the best extant collections of Chinese source materials. Among the other important collections are: the Tokai Zosho-ro Collection (Chinese classics), the Oki Collection (Chinese law), the Niida Collection (Chinese law), the Matsumoto Collection (East Asian diplomacy), the Kiyono Collection (anthropology and archaeology), and the Nagasawa Collection (Chinese drama and novel).

Collections relating to other parts of Asia, including those in local languages, have also been recently augmented. The Library has long been one of the three major Japanese libraries for Oriental scholarship, and each year approximately 7,000 persons, including Orientalists from abroad, make use of its facilities.

THE DOCUMENTATION CENTER FOR ASIAN STUDIES

The main purpose of the Center is to provide various documentation services to scholars and librarians at home and abroad in the field of Asian Studies and thereby contribute to its further advancement. The Center publishes two to three volumes in the *Asian Studies Documentation Series* a year in the following areas: Documents in Chinese and Korean Studies; Political and Legal Documents in Pre-1949 China; Theatrical and Literary Documents in Pre-1949 China. So far, 34 volumes have been published in this series. (see the list in pp. 19-20). These publications are distributed to 293 universities, colleges, and research institutions in Japan and 106 such institutions abroad.

PERIODICALS

The Memoir of The Institute of Oriental Culture (東洋文化研究所紀要)

Published three times a year. Each volume is a collection of academic essays by the research staff of the Institute and its affiliated members. The first volume was published in 1943, and 82 volumes have been published as of March, 1980.

Oriental Culture (東洋文化)

Edited by the research staff of the Institute, inviting contributions from researchers on Asian studies. It began as a Quarterly Journal, but is now published annually as a single volume devoted to a specific subject. The predecessor of *Oriental Culture* was called *The Oriental Culture Review* which ran from vol. 1 (1944) to vol. 11 (1949). With the present name and format the new series began with vol. 1 in 1950 and has so far published 60 vols., the most recent appearing in March, 1980 (vol. 60).

*The Expedition was organized by Prof. N. Egami in 1956 to throw a new light on the following two themes: (1) The origin of agriculture and the process to the stage of civilization; (2) The Ancient civilization of Iran and its connections with ancient civilizations of Japan and Far East. During the first ten years five expeditions were sent to Iraq and Iran. In 1976 expeditions head by Prof. S. Fukai were sent to Iran and Iraq, and in 1978 one was sent to Iran.
